# Repair kit

## User manual



- 1** Preparation: Careful preparation is essential. Start by cleaning the damaged spot on the floor, and make sure that it is free of dirt, oil, wax and grease.
- 2** Colour selection: Choose your colour.
- 3** Melting and mixing
- 4** Filling
- 5** Smoothing: Remove surplus material with the sharp side of the filler applicator.
- 6** Detail work: If you want to simulate the wood grain in detail, use a sharp object to make a groove in the filler and fill the groove with a darker colour.
- 7** Degreasing: Use the grey sanding block to degrease.
- 8** Adjusting the gloss layer: Use the green side of the block for more gloss. The white side will make the surface more matt.
